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Admission policy

We, the Graduate School of Agriculture, Ibaraki University expect entrants to meet the following criteria:

- **The ability to research spontaneously and continuously** - possessing the basic academic knowledge in agriculture and its related fields in addition to complete understanding of/eagerness for understanding the method and techniques necessary for conducting researches.
- **Comprehensive perspectives in global society** - possessing comprehensive understanding/eagerness for understanding of agricultural and food industrial issues in regional and international societies.
- **Cultural sensitivity** - already possessing/having eagerness for gaining communication and language skills to understand diverse cultures and values of others in order to be able to co-operate.
- **Responsibility as part of society** - having a motivated and inquisitive mind to become an advanced professional in agriculture and its related fields.
- **Society Development** - having eagerness to solve matters on food, environment and organisms by utilizing advanced academic knowledge and techniques acquired in regional societies.

(Note 1) This number includes students who were selected at the 1st and 2nd General Selection, so it does not mean 28 students will be selected at this 3rd General Selection.

(Note 2) **All the lectures in this course will be conducted in English. Applicants who wish to study in English should apply for this course.**

(Note 3) International students who are expected to graduate by March 31, 2020 from an university in a country outside of Japan must apply for the Admission by Recommendation for International Students.

2. Application requirements

Applicants must meet both requirements (1) to (2) below.

(1) Applicants must have taken TOEFL, TOEIC, or IELTS, regardless of the date of the test taken.

(2) Applicants must meet one of the following conditions.

- ① Applicants who have graduated (or who are expected to graduate) from the university by March 31, 2020.
- ② Applicants who have received (or who are expected to receive) a bachelor's degree in accordance with National Institution for Academic Degrees and Quality Enhancement of Higher Education under the provision of Paragraph 7 of Article 104 of the School Education Act by March 31, 2020
- ③ Applicants who have completed (or who are expected to complete) 16-year school education program overseas by March 31, 2020.
- ④ Applicants who have completed (or who are expected to complete) 16 years of formal education in foreign countries by taking a correspondence course through a non-Japanese university while residing in Japan by March 31, 2020.
- ⑤ Applicants who have successfully completed (or who are expected to complete) 16 years of formal education and earned a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree from an undergraduate program at an educational institution in a country outside of Japan, which has been assessed by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan to be equivalent to an undergraduate program in the education system of Japan, or who will complete it by March 31, 2020.
- ⑥ Applicants who are designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan.
- ⑦ Applicants who have completed (or who are expected to complete) a professional program (the program must have a course term of more than 4 years or fulfill other criteria stipulated by the MEXT) at a special technical school after the date stipulated by the MEXT on which that school was specially designated by the MEXT by March 31, 2020
- ⑧ Applicants who have been granted (or who are expected to be granted) a degree corresponding to a bachelor's degree in the relevant year by completing a program where the course term is 3 years or more in overseas universities or other overseas schools by March 31, 2020 (Note 1).
- ⑨ Applicants who have studied for more than 3 years at the university by March 31, 2020 and be recognized by the Graduate School of Agriculture as having earned the necessary credits with satisfactory grades (Note 1).
- ⑩ Applicants who have studied for more than 3 years, who have completed 15-year school education program overseas, who have completed 15 years of formal education in foreign countries by taking a correspondence course through a non-Japanese university while residing in Japan, who have successfully completed (or who are expected to complete) 16 years of formal education earned a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree from an undergraduate program at an educational institution in a country outside of Japan, which has been assessed by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan to be equivalent to an undergraduate program in the education system of Japan, be recognized by the Graduate School of Agriculture as having earned the necessary credits with satisfactory grades (Note 1).
- ⑪ Applicants who entered graduate school under the provision of Paragraph 2 of Article 102 of the School Education Act and have been recognized by the Graduate School of Agriculture as having academic abilities suitable for receiving an education in the Graduate School (Note 1).
- ⑫ Applicants who have been recognized by the Graduate School of Agriculture as having academic ability equal or superior to that of a university graduate through an individual entrance qualification screening and who will have reached 22 years of age by March 31, 2020 (Note 2).

(Note 1) Applicants who are qualified under ⑧, ⑨, ⑩ or ⑪ above are required to go through preliminary screening (screening of applicants' qualifications). Please contact the Entrance Examination Office of the Graduate School of Agriculture before applying. Please see page 15 for further information.

(Note 2) Applicants who qualify under ⑫ above are subject to an individual entrance qualification screening (application qualification screening). Please contact the Entrance Examination Office of the Graduate School of Agriculture before applying. Please see pages 15 for further information.

3. Selection procedure

Admission will be determined based on the English test, academic achievement test and interview test. We will use the statement of purpose and the official transcript from the last school attended as part of the reference materials for the admission.

Selection procedure	
English test	We evaluate English ability from the grading certificate of test of TOEFL, TOEIC, or IELTS that you submitted when application procedure.
Academic achievement test	1. Applicants must make a presentation for about 5 minutes. Presentation must be based on applicants graduation thesis (if Applicants don't make graduation thesis, research plan after entrance). 2. We ask and answer questions for about 10 minutes after presentation.
Interview test	We will conduct an interview for about 10 minutes. We will use the statement of purpose and the official transcript from the last school attended as part of the reference materials for admission.

Note

Applicants must prepare 10 handouts about applicants graduation thesis (if Applicants don't make graduation thesis, research plan after entrance) and bring them on the examination day. Handout should be written on only one side of A4-sized paper. Text size in handout is 10.5 point, applicants can use color font as well as figure / table in handout.

5. Application procedure

(1) Documents to be submitted

Applicants are required to submit documents (1) to (9) listed on page 5 as well as “振込払込受付証明書 (Certificate of Remittance)” for the examination fee of 30,000 yen, enclosed in an envelope (332 mm x 240 mm) marked “Graduate School Application Enclosed” in red. These documents must be sent by registered mail if the postal service is used.

Payment of the examination fee

<Paying at a financial institution>

- Use the attached Remittance Form (Note 3) and transfer the examination fee from a financial institution, such as a bank, Shinkin Bank, Japan Post Bank/post offices, or agricultural cooperative bank.
- Make sure to receive two types of receipts from the financial institution : one is “振込払込受付証明書 (Certificate of Remittance)” and another is “振替払込請求書兼受領書(Receipt)” in Japanese. Make sure to check both receipts are stamped by the financial institution.
- Submit “振込払込受付証明書 (Certificate of Remittance)” with the application documents.
- Keep “振替払込請求書兼受領書(Receipt)” until the examination admission card arrives.

(3) Application method

(1) Entrance fee and tuition

Entrance fee: 282,000 yen

Tuition (for the first half year): 267,900 yen (annual amount 535,800 yen)

(Note 1) When the entrance fee or the tuition is changed during the process of admission to the graduate school, the new entrance fee or tuition will be applied from the date of the change.

(Note 2) When the tuition is changed during attendance at the graduate school, the new tuition will be applied from the date of the change.

(Note 3) A tuition exemption system may exempt applicants from all, half or quarter of the amount of the tuition after acceptance.

(Note 4) In addition to entrance fee, other fees such as insurance premiums are required in admission procedure. We will announce amounts of fee in written notification of admission.

(2) Scholarship

Applicants who wish to receive a scholarship may be able to get a scholarship from the Japan Student Services Organization.

7. Special provision on educational method

Article 14 of the Standards for Establishment of Graduate Schools stipulates that graduate schools may, if necessary from an educational standpoint, provide education through appropriate means, which include conducting classes or research guidance in the evening and other certain hours and periods.

8. Long-Term Study Program

The standard term of study is 2 years. The long-term study program is available for those who wish to study and complete a degree through long-term enrollment due to their time limitation. Under this long-term study program, students are able to extend their term of study up to 4 years. The annual tuition under the long-term study program is determined by dividing the total fee paid for the regular program of standard term of study (annual tuition fee x 2 years) by the number of years allowed under the long-term study program (The new tuition fee will be applied when the tuition fee is changed during their enrollment).

- Under the long-term study program, students are allowed to have the 2 years' leave that regular students are also allowed. In this leave, students will be treated as a holdover (a student enrolled in a course for a subsequent time) and tuition fee will be the same as regular students when the term of this program is over.
